Brown Bag Label Discography

Brown bag was distributed by United Artists. The label started its LP series with a controversial album cover for the first album by the rock group Mom's Apple Pie. The original cover showed a drawing of a woman holding a pie with one slice out of it. In the sliced-out section of the pie was a drawing of a woman's genitalia. Record stores got complaints from offended customers and a second cover was quickly issued with a brick wall surrounded by barbed wire substituted in the sliced-out part of the pie. The controversy was enough to almost get the album on the top-200, but with the replacement cover, neither the cover nor the music inside was interesting enough for any substantial sales.
